## What are the keys on the keyboard for?

#### Tab

This moves your computer's focus from one area to another. It also inserts a large space

in a word document. Pressing Tab and Shift moves backwards through the active areas.

# Tab

#### Shift

Press this to get a capital letter or a symbol instead of a number. Shift is useful for selecting whole ranges of files in a folder.

Select the first file, hold down Shift and arrow key to the last.



Ctrl

#### Ctrl

The Control key is useful for shortcuts and also for selecting individual files.

Select the first file, hold down the Ctrl key and

select the others using the Arrow key and Spacebar key.

### **Keyboard shortcuts**

Press and Ctrl and then press: hold to copy to paste to print

#### Windows key

This opens the Start Menu. One press to open, another

press to close. The Start Menu is where you go to access everything on your computer.

#### **Escape**

If you are in "slide show" or software that does not seem to give you a way out, press this key and you will "escape".

#### Backspace -

The backspace key deletes to the left. **Backspace** 

#### Delete -

The delete key deletes to the right or it will delete selected files or folders.

#### **Numeric keypad**

Use the numeric keypad like a calculator to add, subtract, divide and multiply.

#### Switch between windows

**Press** Alt and Tab together to show all open windows:



E.g. **Releasing** the *Tab* key now will open the BBC - Homepage in Internet Explorer.

#### **Spacebar**

This to used to insert a space in a letter, it also "checks" or puts a tick in a box when you are filling in a dialogue box or web form.

#### **Right Click**

#### or short cut menu kev

This opens a menu on your screen that gives you options relevant to where your computer is actively working. Pressing this key is the same as right clicking the mouse.
